Michell Chresfield is a historian of science and Assistant Professor of Africana Studies. Her research focuses on Afro-Indigenous communities known as “tri-racial isolates” and examines their engagement with biological and social scientists across the 20th century. In tracing the enduring scientific interest in triracial populations, her forthcoming book makes clear that triracial populations were central to major scientific theories of the twentieth century and served as a living laboratory through which scientific experts worked out the meaning of racial purity, mixture, and identity. Dr. Chresfield’s writings have appeared in the *Times Literary Supplement*, the *LA Review of Books* and the *Conversation*, while her interviews have been highlighted on BBC Radio 4, the *Globalist* and BBC’s *Women’s Hour*.

Itinerary

DAY 1

QUITO OR GUAYAQUIL, ECUADOR

Arrive in Ecuador, either in Quito, Ecuador's capital city in the Andes, or in the coastal city of Guayaquil, for an included transfer to your convenient hotel for an overnight stay. Both cities are well-served by international carriers, and Galápagos flights start and end in Quito with a stop in Guayaquil. Guests in Guayaquil stay at the locally owned Hotel Oro Verde or have the choice of several hotels in Quito, including a convenient airport hotel.

Note: For those preferring to fly into Quito and overnight, please note the city sits at a 9,350ft elevation. This is an alternative option to Guayaquil, at no additional cost, and is recommended if guests take advantage of an optional extension.

DAY 2

QUITO OR GUAYAQUIL/GALÁPAGOS/EMBARK

This morning, take a required flight to the Galápagos Islands (booked by Lindblad Expeditions at an additional cost) and board *National Geographic Endeavour II*. After lunch, begin your exploration of the islands and their diverse wildlife. (B,L,D)

DAYS 3-8

EXPLORING THE GALÁPAGOS ISLANDS

Listed below is a sample of islands you may visit during your expedition. All ship itineraries are subject to Galápagos National Park regulations. (B,L,D Daily)

North Seymour: Follow coastal trails past curious Galápagos sea lions on this wildlife-rich central island. Continue inland through a silvery forest of endemic palo santo trees, where frigatebirds nest, blue-footed boobies dance and prehistoric-looking land iguanas feeding on cacti.

Rábida: Land on a red-sand beach on this volcanically varied island, where we explore inland. We may see flamingos feeding in a brackish lagoon and clownish brown pelicans entertaining from their nests. Jump in the surrounding waters for a snorkel, or explore by kayak or paddleboard.

Fernandina: One of the most active oceanic volcanoes in the world, Fernandina is the youngest and most pristine island in Galápagos—and home to the strange flightless cormorant, Galápagos penguins and the largest marine iguanas. On shore, hike across impressive recent lava flows.

Isabela: Cross the Equator at Volcán Ecuador, northernmost of Isabela's six great shield volcanoes. Keep an eye out for whales and dolphins, sea turtles and the elusive ocean sunfish. Follow in the footsteps of Charles Darwin and Herman Melville and look for wildlife along the wildly eroded volcanic shore.





DAY 9 ●

Santiago: Explore tide pools and look for fur seals sheltered in quiet grottos of black basalt. Swim, snorkel, kayak and paddleboard along spectacular shorelines and explore an enchanting coastal forest where Charles Darwin once walked.

Santa Cruz: Call at Puerto Ayora, the largest town and headquarters of both the Charles Darwin Research Station and Galápagos National Park. Head to the lush, green highlands to see giant tortoises roaming in the wild.

San Cristóbal: Search for red-footed boobies and the endemic mockingbird and lava lizard—found only on this easternmost island. Explore Baquerizo Moreno, where sea lion colonies thrive in the middle of town.

GALÁPAGOS/DISEMBARK/QUITO OR GUAYAQUIL

Disembark this morning for a return flight to the mainland, then transfer to Hotel Oro Verde in Guayaquil, or have several options in Quito, including a convenient airport hotel. The afternoon and evening are at your leisure. You may be able to take advantage of overnight flights home. (B)

DAY 10 ●

QUITO OR GUAYAQUIL

After breakfast, transfer to the airport and board flights home. (B)

Then immerse yourself in the heart of the Ecuadorian Chocó, one of the world's top five biodiversity hotspots, at Mashpi Lodge.

SEE QUITO • 3 DAYS

From your base at the Swissôtel Quito, experience this vibrant city—the world's first UNESCO World Heritage site—with its dazzling colonial churches and bustling traditional markets. Focus your explorations on the Centro Histórico, where a colonial legacy blends with contemporary Andean culture. This extension adds just one night to your voyage, giving you time to get acclimated to Ecuador before your expedition.

CAPACITY: 52 outside cabins and suites accommodating 96 guests.

REGISTRY: Ecuador. **OVERALL LENGTH:** 236 feet.

National Geographic Endeavour II was designed to meet exacting standards. A beautiful ship, she is lavishly windowed to better frame the never-ending panorama as she voyages from island to island.

PUBLIC AREAS: Forward lounge and bar accommodating all guests for presentations and gatherings, restaurant, large library with Mac kiosks, open-air observation deck, underwater gear area and dual Zodiac boarding platform and "open Bridge," where guests can meet the captain and officers and learn about navigation.

MEALS: Served in a single, unassigned seating in a sociable, informal atmosphere with Ecuadorian flair.

CABINS: All face outside with large windows and feature single beds that convert to a queen. With private facilities and climate control, nightstands, desk and storage. Seven sets of cabins with a connecting door.

EXPEDITION EQUIPMENT: Zodiacs, glass-bottom boat, kayaks and paddleboards, snorkel gear and wetsuits for both adults and children, video microscope and underwater video camera.

SPECIAL FEATURES: National Geographic certified photo instructor, shipboard doctor, National Geographic Explorers-in-Training family program, snorkel instruction, Wi-Fi access, laundry service, Global Gallery.



PRICING: Prices quoted in this flyer are per person based on double occupancy in USD. Under normal conditions the total expedition price is guaranteed at the time advanced payment is made.

However, our expedition pricing is determined far in advance of initial departure on the basis of then-existing projections of fuel and other costs. In the event of increases in those costs, including but not limited to increases in the price of fuel, currency fluctuations, increases in government taxes or levies or increased security costs, we reserve the right to adjust the price of your expedition or add a surcharge to cover such unexpected increases. We will always provide an explanation of the reason for increase in costs.

COST INCLUDES: The rates include seven nights' accommodations aboard ship; all meals and all beverages aboard ship, including beer, wine, cocktails and spirits (a selection of super premium wines and liquors are available for purchase); shore excursions and sightseeing; two nights' hotel accommodations in Quito or Guayaquil with breakfast; arrival/departure transfers for hotel arrangements made through National Geographic-Lindblad Expeditions; Galápagos National Park entry fee; Galápagos Transit Card; use of snorkeling equipment, wetsuits, kayaks and stand-up paddleboards; services of a medical professional, Lindblad Expeditions' leader, naturalist staff and expert guides; all port charges and service taxes; gratuities to local guides; and basic Wi-Fi access.

RESERVATIONS: To confirm your place, an advance payment of 15% of the cabin fare, per person is required and is payable by Visa, MasterCard, American Express, Discover or check. Receipt of advance payment indicates your acceptance of the terms and conditions.

FINAL PAYMENT: Payment is due 120 days prior to departure.

Lindblad Expeditions reserves the right to cancel your reservation if payment has not been received by final payment due date.
