Joseph is an internationally recognized architect and leader of one of the world's premier, brand-name architectural firms, Skidmore, Owings & Merrill LLP (SOM). Originally from Turkey, he spent his teenage years in Germany, attended Cornell and now resides in Northern, NJ, and has spent his career on local, national and international projects. He brings a worldly understanding of design and construction. Additionally, he is versed in the issues of academic and medical buildings, having designed the award-winning John Jay College of Criminal Justice (625,000 square feet) and the Memorial Sloan-Kettering Mortimer B. Zuckerman Research Building (700,000) both in Manhattan. I have known Joseph since 1980. He is a true leader with a quiet, steady style; is an excellent and caring architect; and has an exemplary character and reputation. He is a dedicated Cornellian, having served for over a decade on the AAP Dean's Advisory Council, which he previously served as chair. He would make an excellent addition to the board.

Joseph Doe is a design partner in the New York City office of the international architecture firm Skidmore, Owings, and Merrill. He first joined the firm in 1983, working his way to partner by 1996. In his time with the firm, he has worked out of the New York and London offices, but practices world-wide. Throughout his career, Mr. Doe has designed many corporate, civic, and institutional projects in urban environments. Mr. Doe is interested in creating architecture that will meet the needs of those using the spaces, while positively impacting the environment which surrounds it, being sensitive to the cultural context within which a structure exists. Mr. Doe directs the firm's commitment to educational excellence in the design fields, serving as chairman of the Skidmore, Owings & Merrill (SOM) Foundation which provides grants and fellowships to design students. He is also a director of the Turkish Philanthropic Fund, and a member of several professional and civic organizations. Mr. Doe is a Fellow of the American Institute of Architects, a member of the New York Real Estate Board, and has frequently been asked to serve as a selection panelist for the prestigious Paul and Daisy Soros Fellowships for New Americans. He has also been widely recognized for his projects by the AIA, Progressive Architecture, Architectural Review, and Chicago Athenaeum-American Architecture Awards.
