Experience diverse lands connected by navigation, empire, and exchange: Cruise the Atlantic from Spain's volcanic **Canary Islands** to **Morocco's** ancient ports and imperial cities in North Africa. Sail the **Strait of Gibraltar** to the mighty Rock, then onward to **Andalusian Spain** and the blissful **Portuguese Algarve** along the Mediterranean.

Marvel at the Canary Islands' volcanic terrain, beginning with an overnight hotel stay on **Tenerife**. This island is known for its 17th-century mansions and the moon-like rock formations of Teide National Park, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. After a day of exploring **Gran Canaria**, where Christopher Columbus set forth for the Americas, board *Exploris One* for your journey. Enjoy behind-the-scenes excursions to cities such as **Marrakesh, Casablanca, Rabat, Essaouira, Tangier, Tétouan, and Safi**, Morocco's pottery capital.

Cross the ancient Pillars of Hercules to **Gibraltar**. Beneath the Rock, join an expert to explore little-known World War II history: a 34-mile underground city built by British Royal Engineers to house 16,000 troops. Sail the Mediterranean to Andalusia, experiencing such cities as **Cádiz**, one of Europe's oldest; **Seville**, home to the world's largest Gothic cathedral and the Alcázar, Europe's oldest functioning royal residence; and **Jerez**, where you may taste sherry drawn from 19th-century cellars once reserved for kings.

Conclude in the Algarve, standing in the fortress where Prince Henry's cartographers charted new worlds, then visit the site of Europe's first market for enslaved people to understand the human cost of Portugal's Age of Discoveries. Disembark in **Lisbon**, where you may enjoy an optional postlude from **May 9 to 11, 2026**.

Sail in the company of alumni from Columbia, Harvard, the University of Michigan, the University of Miami in Ohio, Vanderbilt, and Wake Forest. As this is expected to be a very popular offering, **we encourage you to contact our tour**

MONDAY, APRIL 27: DEPARTURE

Depart to Tenerife on an overnight flight.

TUESDAY, APRIL 28: TENERIFE, CANARY ISLANDS, SPAIN

Upon arrival, transfer to the Hotel Botánico. Depending on your arrival time, lunch is included. This evening, attend a welcome reception with *canapés*.

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WEDNESDAY, APRIL 29: TENERIFE / TEIDE NATIONAL PARK OR LA OROTAVA / SANTA CRUZ / EMBARK *EXPLORIS ONE*

Select your preferred exploration for today before sailing:

Full-Day Option 1: Teide National Park. Explore a UNESCO-listed volcanic landscape and share a picnic near Spain's highest peak.

Full-Day Option 2: La Orotava. Walk cobbled streets with a guide to view 17th-century mansions built on the island's historic wine trade.

Afternoon Option: Jardín de Aclimatación de la Orotava. Enjoy your morning and lunch at leisure, then visit Spain's second-oldest botanical garden, founded in 1788 to acclimatize plant species from around the globe.

Evening (All Guests): Auditorio de Tenerife. Tour Spanish visionary architect Santiago Calatrava's sculptural concert hall before boarding *Exploris One*. B,L,D

THURSDAY, APRIL 30: LAS PALMAS DE GRAN CANARIA

Discover Las Palmas de Gran Canaria, Christopher Columbus's last stop before his 1492 Atlantic crossing. Select from today's options:

Full-Day Option: Old Town Tour. Join private tours of such architectural treasures as the lavish Neoclassical Teatro Pérez Galdós. Gather for lunch at the 19th-century Gabinete Literario after a welcome from a town official.

Morning Option 1: Roque Nublo Hike & Yoga.

Walk volcanic trails and join a yoga session near Gran Canaria's ancient summit; afternoon at leisure.

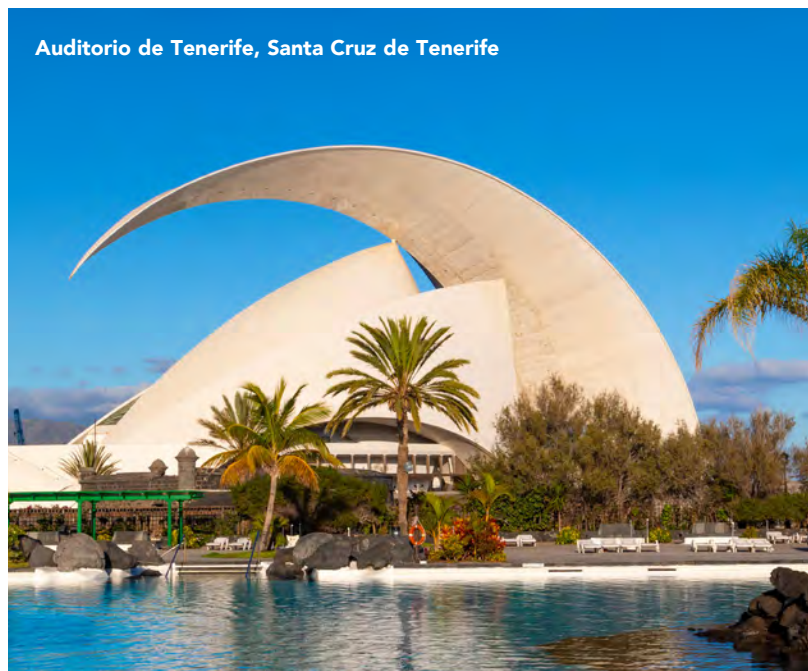
Morning Option 2: Alfredo Kraus Auditorium. Enjoy special access and a private concert in this sleek hall overlooking the Atlantic.

Evening (All Guests): Attend the Captain's welcome reception and dinner aboard *Exploris One*. B,L,R,D

FRIDAY, MAY 1: ARRECIFE (LANZAROTE)

Step ashore in Arrecife, Lanzarote, to explore landscapes forged by volcanoes and reimagined as a living canvas by local artist César Manrique (1919–1992).

MORNING

Musical Performance at Los Jameos del Agua. Experience this 550-seat auditorium that Manrique converted from a series of collapsed lava tubes.

AFTERNOON

Lunch is at El Diablo Restaurant in Timanfaya, UNESCO-recognized volcanic terrain. Watch chefs grill dishes with geothermal heat radiating from the dormant volcano below.

Option 1: Expert-Guided Tour of the César Manrique Foundation, the artist's former home built atop a lava flow, integrating volcanic caves into its design.

Option 2: Bodega La Geria Private Wine Tour & Tasting. Learn about Lanzarote's unique winemaking process in these volcanic vineyards. B,L,D

SATURDAY, MAY 2: DAY AT SEA

As *Exploris One* sails towards the Moroccan coast, enjoy a relaxing day at sea. You may choose to attend onboard lectures, savor treatments in the ship's spa facilities, or simply relax on deck as you cross the open waters. B,L,D

SUNDAY, MAY 3: SAFI, MOROCCO / MARRAKESH OR ESSAOUIRA

Welcome to North Africa. Arrive in Safi, Morocco's pottery capital, and select from two full-day, expert-guided excursions or a half-day pottery experience in Safi:

Full-Day Option 1: Explore Marrakesh, the imperial "Red City." Go behind the scenes at the early 20th-century Dar El Bacha, the former palace of a pasha, and watch street performers in UNESCO-listed Djemaa el F'na Square.

Discover Yves Saint Laurent's Marrakesh at Villa Oasis, his cobalt-blue former home; Jardin Majorelle, the garden he rescued from developers; and his designs at the YSL Museum.

Full-Day Option 2: Essaouira. In this coastal city, rebuilt in 1765 by a French architect, explore its UNESCO-listed medina, whitewashed architecture, 18th-century sea bastions, and the once-thriving Jewish quarter. Enjoy a seafood lunch and leisure time.

Half-Day Option: Private Pottery Course in Safi.

Join an artisan to learn the secrets of Moroccan ceramics during a private hands-on workshop. Discover more about pottery traditions on a guided tour of the National Ceramics Museum. Enjoy the remainder of the day at leisure. B,L,D

MONDAY, MAY 4: CASABLANCA / RABAT

From Casablanca, Morocco's largest city and chief port, choose among these options:

Full-Day Option 1: Casablanca Exploration. Arrive in Casablanca for a guided inside look at the innovatively designed Hassan II Mosque, built partially over the Atlantic.

Travel through the Ain Diab coastal resort area to the Anfa district, Casablanca's ancient core. Enjoy free time in the main square, Place Mohammed V.

Full-Day Option 2: Rabat. After touring the Hassan II Mosque, transfer to Morocco's capital, Rabat, to visit the Mohammed VI Museum of Modern and Contemporary Art and an enchanting stroll through the seaside 12th-century Kasbah des Oudaïas, Rabat's oldest quarter. B,L,D

TUESDAY, MAY 5: TANGIER / ASILAH OR TÉTOUAN

Step ashore in glamorous Tangier with these options today:

Half-Day Option: Tangier Exploration. Enjoy guided looks at the Tangier American Legation Museum, the only U.S. National Historic Landmark abroad, and the Kasbah Museum, a former sultan's palace housing antiquities such as Roman mosaics.

Full-Day Option 1: Asilah & Private Garden Visit.

Travel to the mythical Caves of Hercules, where the Greek god Heracles slept, according to legend, and look out of its famous Africa-shaped opening onto the Strait of Gibraltar.

Stroll through Asilah, an ancient fortified city of whitewashed architecture, 15th-century Portuguese ramparts, and colorful murals.



Royal Andalusian School of Equestrian Art, Jerez



Enjoy an *al fresco* lunch and private tour at Rohuna Garden, created by Italian horticulturist Umberto Pasti to preserve Moroccan wild plants.

Full-Day Option 2: Explore Tétouan's UNESCO-listed medina.

Enjoy an exclusive visit to a traditional art school to observe students at work, followed by a visit to Morocco's largest Jewish cemetery. B,L,D

WEDNESDAY, MAY 6: GIBRALTAR, UNITED KINGDOM

Stand on deck as *Exploris One* navigates the Strait of Gibraltar, the ancient Pillars of Hercules, before arriving at the British Overseas Territory defined by its 1,398-foot limestone rock.

Ascend into Saint Michael's Cave, a natural grotto known since Roman times. Explore a subterranean city created for 16,000 troops inside the World War II Tunnels, a 34-mile network carved by British Royal Engineers. B,L,D

THURSDAY, MAY 7: CÁDIZ, SPAIN / JEREZ DE LA FRONTERA OR SEVILLE

Andalusian Spain awaits today with these optional excursions:

Morning Option 1: Cádiz Exploration. Discover Cádiz, one of Western Europe's oldest cities. Visit the 18th-century Catedral de la Santa Cruz and enter the Oratorio de la Santa Cueva to view three canvases by Francisco Goya.

Morning Option 2: Jerez Equestrian Art. At the globally prestigious Royal Andalusian School of Equestrian Art, enjoy a performance of classical dressage and exclusive behind-the-scenes access to the stables and training areas.

Afternoon Option: Jerez Sherry Experience. Go behind the scenes at Bodegas Gonzalez Byass, the birthplace of Tío Pepe Fino. Learn secrets of sherry production inside 19th-century cellars, followed by a tasting with tapas.

Full-Day Option: UNESCO World Heritage Sites in Seville. Visit the world's largest Gothic cathedral and enjoy expert-led tours of the Alcázar, Europe's oldest continuously used royal palace, and La Casa de Pilatos, a 15th-century palace known for its extensive *azulejo* tilework. B,L,D

FRIDAY, MAY 8: PORTIMÃO, PORTUGAL / SAGRES / LAGOS

The program's final day takes us to the lush Portuguese Algarve. From Portimão, explore the region's cultural and natural treasures with your choice of excursions:

Full-Day Option 1: Art & History in Sagres and Lagos.

At Europe's southwestern tip, join a curator at the Renaissance ruins of the Fortress of Sagres, where Henry the Navigator established his 15th-century "school."

In Lagos, visit the Igreja de Santo António to see its Baroque gilded woodwork and *azulejo* tiles. Participate in a powerful guided tour of the 15th-century Mercado de Escravos, Europe's first modern market for the trafficking of enslaved people.

Full-Day Option 2: Nature in Trilho dos Moinhos and Monchique. Hike the windmill-lined trails near Monchique, through forested hills rich with birdlife.

Evening (All Guests): Return to the ship for a private concert featuring a local saxophonist, followed by a festive farewell dinner. B,L,D

SATURDAY, MAY 9: LISBON / DISEMBARK / RETURN

Disembark and transfer to the Lisbon airport for your return flight. B

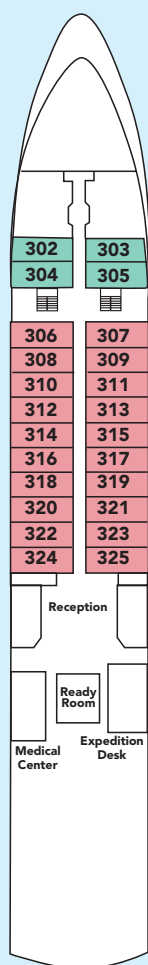
