Launched in 2018, this 18-cabin vessel offers a relaxed, casual ambiance and the unique ability to access small, inviting islands and ports that larger ships cannot reach.

Sail along Croatia's breathtaking coastline, visiting the lush island of Mljet, the historic towns of Korčula, and Hvar, and the vibrant cultural centers of Split and Trogir. The itinerary's leisurely pace allows for overnight stays in port, providing ample free time to sample local cuisine, explore on your own, and connect with residents. Along the way, enjoy walking tours, wine tastings, and moments to soak in the rich heritage and lively waterfront scenes of each destination.

The adventure concludes with a visit to Zadar before traveling inland to Slovenia's charming capital, Ljubljana, and the picturesque Lake Bled.

Highlights

- ▶ Dive into the historic grandeur of **Dubrovnik**, known as the “Pearl of the Adriatic.”
- ▶ Appreciate the **sculptures of Ivan Meštrović**, of one of the most prominent Croatian artists of the first half of the 20th century, on a guided tour of Meštrović Gallery, located in his former villa in Split.
- ▶ Swim in secluded coves in the **pristine waters of the Adriatic Sea**.
- ▶ Sample local delicacies and some of **Croatia’s most famous wines** in Korčula.
- ▶ Marvel at the ruins of **Emperor Diocletian’s Palace** in Split.
- ▶ Take guided walks at **Plitvice National Park** on wooden walkways and bridges through the magical landscape of cascading waterfalls, picturesque pools, and lush vegetation.
- ▶ Moor at or near town centers aboard the yacht *Queen Eleganza*, with easy **walk-off access to explore independently**.
- ▶ Explore **Ljubljana**, Slovenia’s charming capital city, and ride gondola-like pletnas on the remarkably blue waters of Lake Bled.

Itinerary

FRIDAY/ SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 18 & 19 HOME / DUBROVNIK, CROATIA

Depart home on an overnight flight to Dubrovnik. Upon arrival, transfer to the 5-star Hotel Dubrovnik Palace, overlooking the Adriatic Sea.

Relax and settle in, then gather for an orientation, welcome reception, and dinner.
HOTEL DUBROVNIK PALACE (R,D)

SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 20

DUBROVNIK

Begin the day with a morning lecture, then set out on a guided walking tour of Dubrovnik's historic Old Town. Known for its imposing stone walls and signature red-tiled rooftops, Dubrovnik is one of the Adriatic's most iconic cities. Stroll along the marble-paved Stradun and visit landmarks such as Onofrio's Fountain, St. Blaise's Church, and the Franciscan Monastery complex—home to a historic library and one of the oldest still-operating pharmacies in Europe, established in 1317.

Enjoy free time in the afternoon to wander the city's narrow alleyways, discover hidden courtyards, or take in the coastal views. Later, board the *Queen Eleganza* and settle into your cabin before gathering for a welcome reception and dinner.

MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 21

MLJET

Relax on the sun deck while cruising to the picturesque island of Mljet. At Mljet National Park, walk or e-bike among shady forests of Aleppo pine, or take a refreshing swim in a tranquil saltwater lake. Take a small ferry to see the Benedictine monastery on St. Mary's Island. Dinner is at leisure this evening.

TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 22

KORČULA

En route to the fortified town of Korčula, enjoy a swim in a calm cove, (weather permitting.)

Situated on a scenic promontory, Korčula is known for its rolling vineyards, olive groves, charming villages, and remarkably preserved old town. The island also boasts a rich heritage of religious traditions, folk music, and dance. Take in the highlights on a guided walking tour, then enjoy a tasting of regional delicacies paired with some of Croatia's most renowned wines.

WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 23

HVAR

Today cruise to lavender scented Hvar Island, known as the "Queen of the Dalmatian islands." Stroll along the elegant main square and visit a Franciscan monastery whose refectory contains a 1524 edition of Ptolemy's Atlas and a large painting of the Last Supper.

Enjoy time to wander the yacht-lined waterfront and lively promenades, where cafés and restaurants offer the perfect setting for a relaxing evening.

KORČULA



THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 24

SPLIT

Enjoy another lecture by Professor Anderson, en route to Split. Upon arrival, explore the impressive Diocletian's Palace, a monumental Roman structure stretching along the waterfront. Enjoy free time to wander the pedestrian-friendly Old Town. In the evening, discover local delicacies at one of the city's many inviting restaurants.

QUEEN ELEGANZA (B,L)

FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 25

TROGIR

Before cruising to Trogir, enjoy a guided tour of Meštrović Gallery, the former villa of Croatia's premier 20th-century sculptor, Ivan Meštrović.

A walking tour introduces you to the tiny, but charming Old Town of Trogir, a designated UNESCO World Heritage Site. For dinner, savor a traditional *peka*, meat and potatoes slowly roasted over coals under an iron bell, at a local restaurant.

QUEEN ELEGANZA (B,L,D)

SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 26

AT SEA / ZADAR

As the ship makes its way to Zadar, enjoy a final lecture about pirates in the Adriatic during the Middle Ages. In the late afternoon, explore Zadar's Old Town on a guided walking tour, featuring highlights such as the Roman Forum and the circular Church of St. Donat. This evening, gather on board to toast the journey with a farewell dinner.

QUEEN ELEGANZA (B,L,D)

SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 27

LJUBLJANA, SLOVENIA

Disembark this morning and travel by motorcoach to Ljubljana. En route, visit Plitvice Lakes National Park, a UNESCO World Heritage site known for its cascading lakes and waterfalls set in a lush forest landscape. Upon arrival in Ljubljana, check in to a centrally located hotel.

MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 28

LJUBLJANA

Begin the day with a walking tour of Ljubljana's historic center, visiting landmarks such as the Dragon Bridge and the ancient Roman wall. Then, travel by motorcoach to Lake Bled, where you'll enjoy a lakeside lunch before boarding a pletna boat to visit the church-topped island. Return to Ljubljana for a farewell dinner in a cozy restaurant.

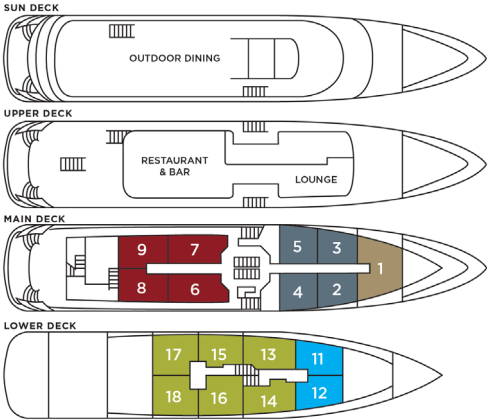




Ship

Launched in spring 2018, the super yacht *Queen Eleganza* was built in Croatia for cruising the Adriatic coastline. Designed for an intimate travel experience, the vessel accommodates up to 28 guests, creating a relaxed and informal atmosphere on board.

Each of the 18 cabins features modern design and a neutral color palette. The lounge, bar, and restaurant areas offer comfortable seating, large windows, and complimentary tea and coffee throughout the day. Meals are served in a single seating and feature fresh Mediterranean cuisine.

WHAT TO EXPECT

This is a moderately strenuous program that is at times physically demanding and busy. Participants must be physically fit, active, and in good health. Daily programs involve walking one to two miles—through city centers, historic sites, and in museums, where there may also be extended periods of standing. Participants will encounter uneven terrain, including dirt and cobblestoned paths, and must be able to walk at least 20 minutes up and down hills

without stopping. Participants must be able to stand outside for up to two hours with limited shade and no available seating. All participants will be required to follow safety/sanitization protocols set forth by Cornell University and Criterion Travel, local staff, and host country laws. If the tour manager decides that a participant cannot visit a site safely or in a timely manner, their judgment will be final. Where possible, an alternate activity may be suggested; additional costs may apply.

GROUP SIZE

This program is exclusive to Cornell University and is limited to 28 participants.

TRAVEL INSURANCE

Insurance for trip cancellation and interruption, medical problems, baggage loss and delays, etc., is highly recommended. Cancellation policies that apply are included in this brochure. Information about travel insurance will be sent to confirmed participants.
