## *Who can use the Wi-Fi networks at Cornell?*

<b>eduroam</b> Secure Wi-Fi. Fast, private connections. Used by visitors from participating eduroam institutions. Available on many campuses around the world.	X		X (if registered at an eduroam institution)	
<b>Cornell-Visitor</b> Non-secure Wi-Fi. Best used only when secure Wi-Fi is not an option. Your data transmissions are not private and could be intercepted by others.		X	X	X

## **Eduroam**

---

Connect to eduroam, Cornell's secure wireless (Wi-Fi) network, to access the Internet, keep everything you do online private, and use your eduroam account at [other eduroam institutions\(link is external\)](#).

1. Select the eduroam Wi-Fi network.
2. Sign in with your NetID@cornell.edu and NetID password.
3. Accept the network-access.it.cornell.edu certificate and you are online.  
If you need detailed instructions (including smartphones and iPads), see the instructions at the right.

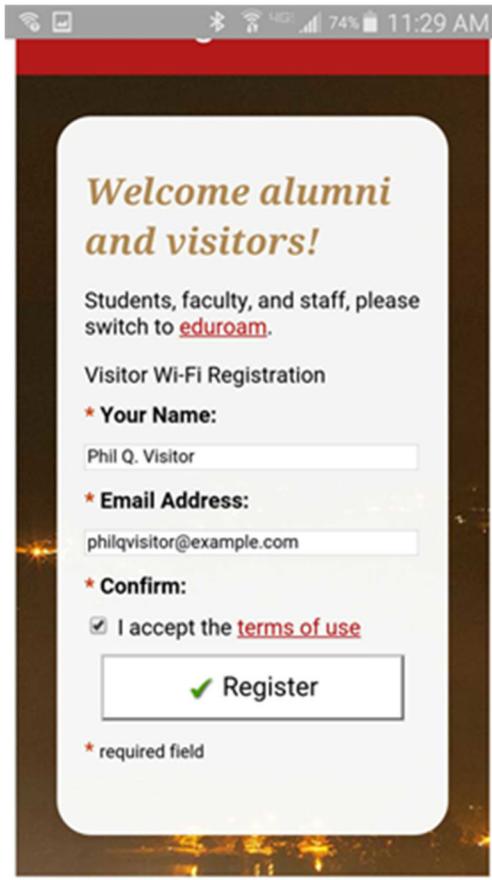

## Cornell-Visitor

---

Register to use the Cornell-Visitor network. Follow the steps below.

1. Select **Cornell-Visitor** from the list of available Wi-Fi networks on your device.
2. A browser window should open automatically. You should see the Cornell-Visitor registration screen.

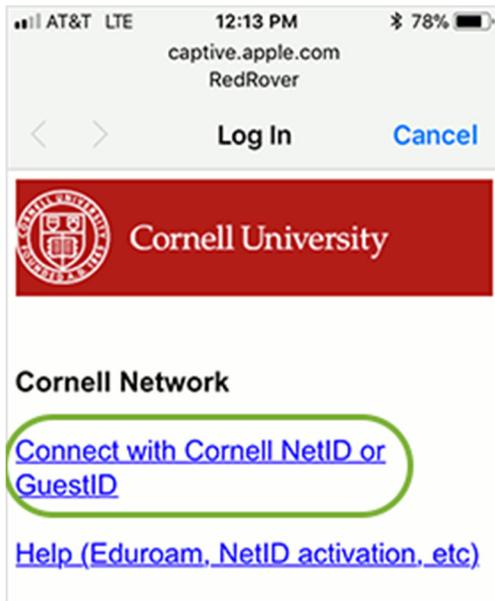
3. Enter your name and email address and then check the box that you accept the terms of use.
4. Click **Register**.
5. You'll see a confirmation screen. Click **Log In**. Because this is a visitor network, you will need to register your device daily.

---

## RedRover

---

1. Tap **Settings**.
2. Tap **Wi-Fi**.
3. Tap **RedRover**.
4. Open Safari/any web browser to connect to the Internet. If this is the first time you're connecting to RedRover with this device, you'll be asked to complete a quick registration process. Cornell University [Policy 5.7, Network Registry](#), requires registration of all devices connected to the network. The following steps apply only when you're registering a device.
5. On the Cornell Network page, click **Connect with Cornell NetID or GuestID**.



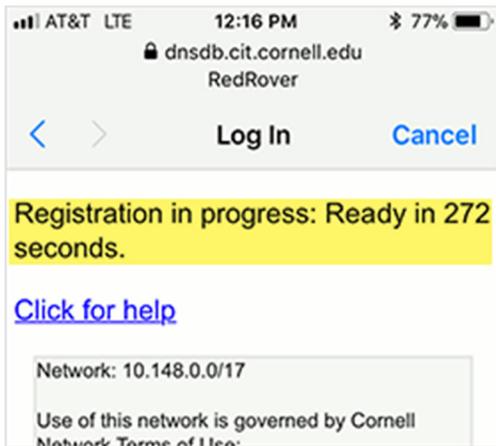
6. On the CUWebLogin page, enter your Cornell NetID or GuestID and password, and if necessary, select the ID Type. Then click **Login**.

7. On the Registration page, enter a Description for the device, and then click **Register**. The description should help you identify which devices you've registered. Enter a description that makes sense to you.



8. Registration can take up to 5 minutes to take effect. To use the device immediately, reboot it.
