



Warren Allmon is Director of the Paleontological Research Institution in Ithaca, a position he has held since 1992. From 2008 to 2024 he was the Hunter Rawlings III Professor of Paleontology in Cornell's Department of Earth & Atmospheric Sciences. Since 2012 he has taught evolution to undergraduates at Shoals Marine Lab. His research focuses on fossil marine mollusks and macroevolution. He has led CAU trips to Patagonia, Iceland, Galapagos, and Antarctica.

Your Itinerary

DAY 1 ◆ SANTIAGO, CHILE

Arrive in Santiago and explore the city at your leisure.

DAY 2 • FLY TO USHUAIA, ARGENTINA/EMBARK

Fly on our recommended flight to Ushuaia, the southern-most city in the world, and we will provide transfers to the airport and luggage assistance.* Enjoy lunch onboard a private catamaran cruise on the Beagle Channel before embarking the ship.

DAYS 3-4 • AT SEA/DRAKE PASSAGE

We awake this morning well into our journey across the Drake Passage. Lying between Cape Horn and the Antarctic Peninsula, the Drake holds a unique place in maritime lore. Sometimes misty and gray, other times calm and clear, crossing the legendary Drake Passage is unforgettable—a milestone in any adventurer's personal travel history. (B,L,D)

DAYS 5-9 EXPLORING ANTARCTICA

With long hours of daylight at this time of year, you have ample opportunity to explore the Antarctic Peninsula and the surrounding islands. In keeping with the nature of an expedition, the schedule is flexible so that we can take advantage of the unexpected—watching whales perform off the bow, taking an after-dinner Zodiac cruise, or heading out on an unplanned landing. We anticipate making landings to walk ashore and kayak among the ice floes and experience close encounters with wildlife. You may have the thrill of watching the powerful ship head into the pack ice or stepping ashore to thousands of Adélie and chinstrap penguins. You'll learn how climate change affects the penguin populations and how to best capture images of those same penguins from an accomplished professional photographer. Back aboard, the undersea specialist may present video from that day's dive or show rare images taken up to 1,000 feet below the surface using the ROV. The expert staff will craft an expedition where you will learn, see, and experience more. (B,L,D)

DAYS 10-11 ♦ AT SEA

Enjoy the ship's amenities as the Antarctic coast disappears from view, round the southernmost tip of South America, and see the meeting of the Atlantic and Pacific Oceans. Celebrate your voyage at a farewell dinner on board. (B,L,D)

DAY 12 • USHUAIA/DISEMBARK/SANTIAGO

Disembark in Ushuaia, and fly on our recommended flights to Santiago for your flights home; we'll provide transfers to the airport and luggage assistance.*

CAPACITY: 138 guests in 76 outside cabins.

PUBLIC AREAS: Observation lounge with bar, three dining areas, gym, wellness area, outdoor infinity hot tubs, and twin glass igloos equipped for overnight stays, library, main lounge with full service bar, 24-hour beverage, state-of-the-art facilities for films, slideshows and presentations, OM System Photo Gear Locker, laundry, and a photo workshop area; plus, an expedition base with lockers for expedition gear, and an open Bridge for access to our captain, officers, and the art of navigation.

MEALS: Two restaurants featuring local, sustainable choices and unassigned seating for flexible, inclusive dining; plus, a Chef's table for intimate, small group dining. Main restaurant has 270° views, and the Observation deck restaurant features lighter, made-to-order fare.

ACCOMMODATIONS: All cabins and suites face outside with large windows, private bathrooms, and climate controls. Cabins are equipped with expedition command centers with iPad tablets, multiple electrical and USB outlets, TVs with on demand entertainment, phone, Wi-Fi connections, clock, barometers, hygrometers, vanity mirror, mini refrigerator, small safe, ice bucket, glasses, hair dryer, reading lights, and an atlas, complimentary insulated water bottles, and luxury linens and pillows. Bathrooms are outfitted with rain showers and hand-held shower, botanically inspired shampoo, conditioner, shower gel, and lotion. Balcony cabins have hammocks, chairs, and a table.

EXPEDITION EQUIPMENT: Zodiacs, kayaks, undersea specialist operating a Remotely Operated Vehicle (ROV) and underwater video camera for unique access to polar marine world, hydrophone, aerial remote-controlled camera, and video microscope.

STAFF & CREW: Every member of our staff is committed to ensuring our guests have an unforgettable experience. Many of our veteran guides and naturalists are locally based in your destination and have worked with us for decades. A full-time medical professional, undersea specialist, National Geographic Photography Expert and a Lindblad Expeditions-National Geographic certified photo instructor are on board, and with a low staff-to-guest ratio, you can hear different perspectives and gain new insights every day.

WELLNESS: The spa is staffed by our wellness specialists and features a glass-enclosed yoga studio, gym, treatment rooms, spa relax area, and high and low-heat saunas with ocean views.



PRICING: Prices quoted are per person based on double occupancy in USD. Prices quoted are subject to change and availability at time of booking. Under normal conditions the total expedition price is guaranteed at the time advanced payment is made. However, our expedition pricing is determined far in advance of initial departure on the basis of then-existing projections of fuel and other costs. In the event of increases in those costs, including but not limited to increases in the price of fuel, currency fluctuations, increases in government taxes or levies, or increased security costs, we reserve the right to adjust the price of your expedition or add a surcharge to cover such unexpected increases. We will always provide an explanation of the reason for increase in costs.

COST INCLUDES: Accommodations aboard ship and in hotels per itinerary; all meals, nonalcoholic and alcoholic beverages aboard ship (except certain super premium brands of alcohol); shore excursions, sightseeing, entrance fees, and special access permits; transfers to and from group flights; use of kayaks; tips (including gratuities to the ship's crew); taxes, service charges and port charges; basic Wi-Fi; services of a medical professional, our expedition leader and naturalist staff and local guides; a complimentary parka for each guest. Unused services of items included in our programs are non-refundable.

NOT INCLUDED: Air transportation to Santiago and return, charter flights between Santiago and Ushuaia at an additional cost (must be booked through Lindblad Expeditions); extensions; passport, visa, security and immigration fees; meals not indicated; travel protection plan; items of a personal nature such as spa services, certain super premium brands of alcohol, enhanced and premium Wi-Fi plans, and laundry.

AIRFARE: Airfare is an additional cost. Round-trip charter airfare between Santiago/Ushuaia must be ticketed by Lindblad Expeditions. Airfares subject to change. Lindblad Expeditions will gladly assist in making your air arrangements for a \$50 per person service fee.

RESERVATIONS: To confirm your place, an advance payment of 15% of the cabin fare, per person is payable by VISA, MasterCard, American Express, Discover or check. Receipt of advance payment indicates your acceptance of the terms and conditions.

FINAL PAYMENT: Due no later than 120 days prior to departure. Lindblad Expeditions reserves the right to cancel your reservation if payment has not been received by final payment due date.

TRAVEL PROTECTION PLAN: Travel protection and medical insurance are available at extra cost. Information will be sent upon registration.

ENTRY AND VISA REQUIREMENTS: Guests are advised to verify travel documents (passport/transit visa/entry visa) for the country(s) through which they are transiting and/or entering.
